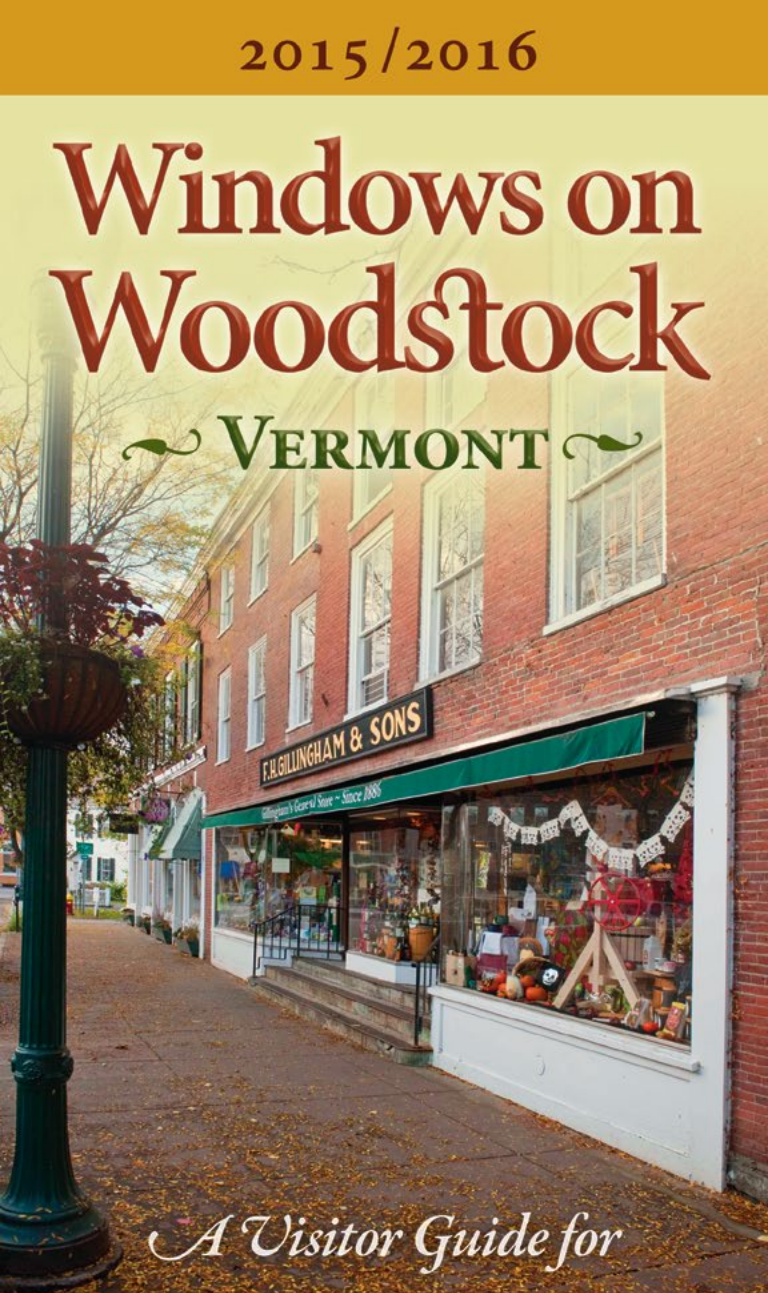

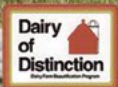

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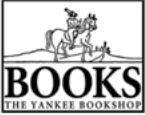

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

Usually only 2.5 hours from Boston. Take I-93 North to I-89 through New Hampshire to Exit One in Vermont labeled Woodstock/Rutland. Turn left onto Route 4 West. Woodstock is 13 miles.

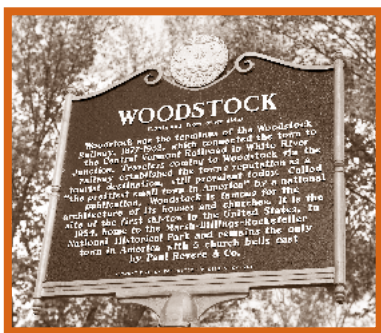
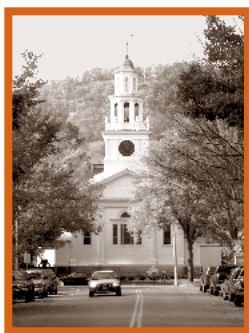
Usually only 4.5 hours from New York and Fairfield County Connecticut. Take I-95 North or the Merritt Parkway to I-91 North just south of Hartford. Go to Exit 9 labeled Hartland/Windsor. Turn left onto Route 5 North into Hartland, then turn left onto Route 12 North. Go 10 miles to the junction of Route 4 and turn left. Woodstock is four miles.

From Upstate and Western New York. Take I-87 North to Exit 24 (Adirondack Northway). Take Northway to Exit 20 labeled Fort Ann/Whitehall. Follow NY Route 149 to US Route 4 in Fort Ann. Follow signs for Route 4 East through Rutland to Woodstock. When you arrive in Woodstock, please travel through the village mindful of the speed limits and pedestrian walkways and enjoy your stay.

PARKING

Parking is metered Monday through Saturday in the village to provide adequate parking for our visitors. Meters take quarters and can be fed throughout the day for two-hour and four-hour spaces. Meters are monitored between 10 AM and 4 PM, Monday–Saturday. Free parking on Sundays and most holidays. Free parking is offered on the north side of the Green, on Elm Street and off Pleasant Street. Or go to the west side of town beyond the Town Hall and on weekends in the Elementary School parking area. Woodstock is pleased to offer a parking ticket validation program. If you over-stayed at your meter and get a parking ticket, please take the ticket to any merchant or restaurant and they will be pleased to **VALIDATE** your ticket! No Fee!





TOWN WELCOME CENTER & PUBLIC RESTROOMS

Located on Mechanic Street in the shopping district. Our friendly staff is there to help you 9AM–5PM daily. Rest rooms are also available at the Town Hall, Monday–Friday, 8AM–5PM.

YOUR DOG

Woodstock is a walking town and we welcome our canine friends. Please take advantage of the plastic bags we offer throughout the village and pick up after your dog on all public areas including woodland trails in the National Park and on village property. Your dog must be on a leash at all times and under control. Please do not leave your friend tied unattended or in a car in the heat. Many inns and shops welcome dog visitors.

Government

Woodstock is one of the few Vermont municipalities organized as a town, and within the boundaries of the town, there exists an incorporated village. The Town of Woodstock is governed by a five-member Select Board and the Village of Woodstock is governed by a five-member Board of Trustees. Administrative offices are located in the Town Hall. Here you will find the Town Clerk, Municipal Manager, Zoning Office, Board of Listers, Treasurer and Tax Collector. In addition to housing these offices, there are the conference rooms where official meetings take place. The Municipal Manager's Office (serving both town and village) is open from 8AM-4:30PM and is closed for lunch between Noon and 1PM.

The town and village of Woodstock each have a set of zoning by-laws that regulate all land development, building construction and property uses. Permits are required before any activity may take place. The Zoning Office hours are 8AM-4:30PM and closed for lunch between Noon and 1 PM. The elected Board of Listers is responsible for establishing the value of all property in town for tax purposes. The office is open from 8AM-11:30AM Monday through Thursday.

The town and village tax rate is set annually in June. Please call the Municipal Manager's office at 802-457-3456 for more information.

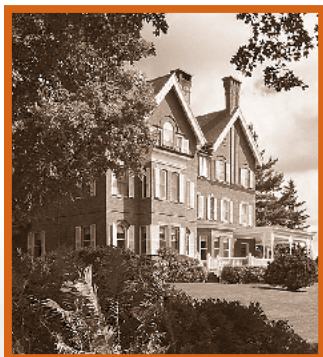

Middle Bridge

Tragically, it was burned by vandals in 1974, however, restored through the generosity of the community. It spans the Ottauquechee River and welcomes visitors on a walk around River Street and Mountain Avenue, past some of Woodstock's most beautiful homes.

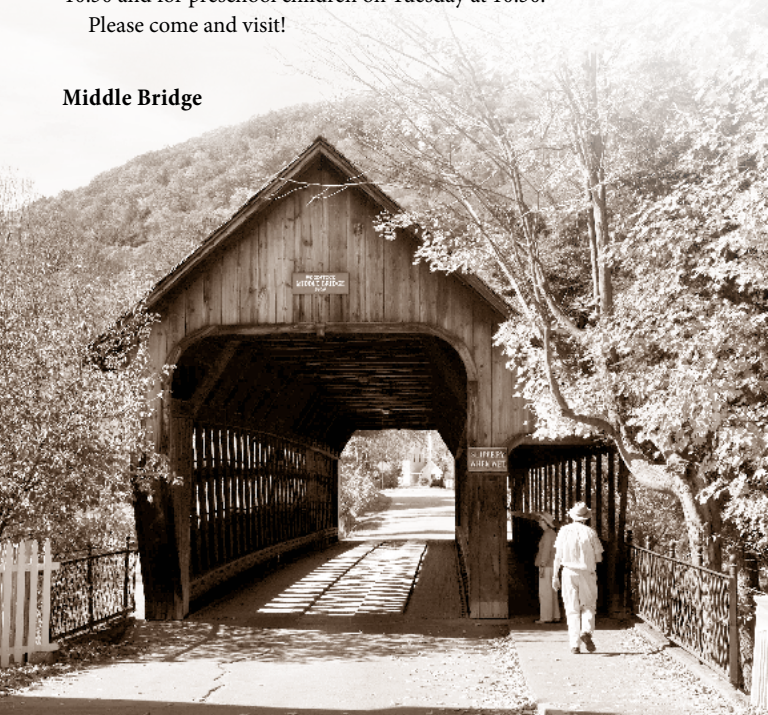

Woodstock is the only American town with five of the bells manufactured at the Massachusetts foundry once owned by Paul Revere. The earliest, dating to 1818 and purchased for \$351, is on the porch of the Congregational Church. Another rests in the garden of The Woodstock Inn & Resort. Three others still ring at the Masonic Temple (formerly the Christian Church), St. James Episcopal Church, and the North Universalist Chapel Society.

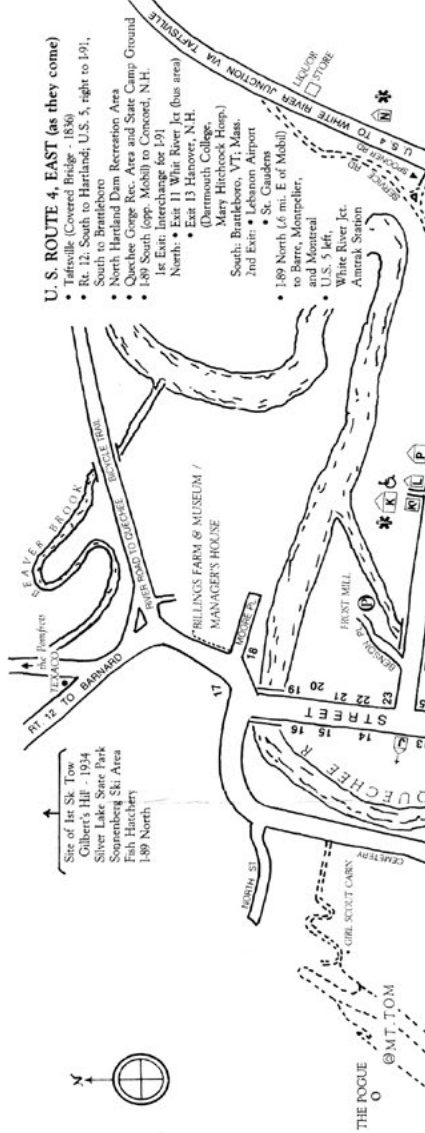

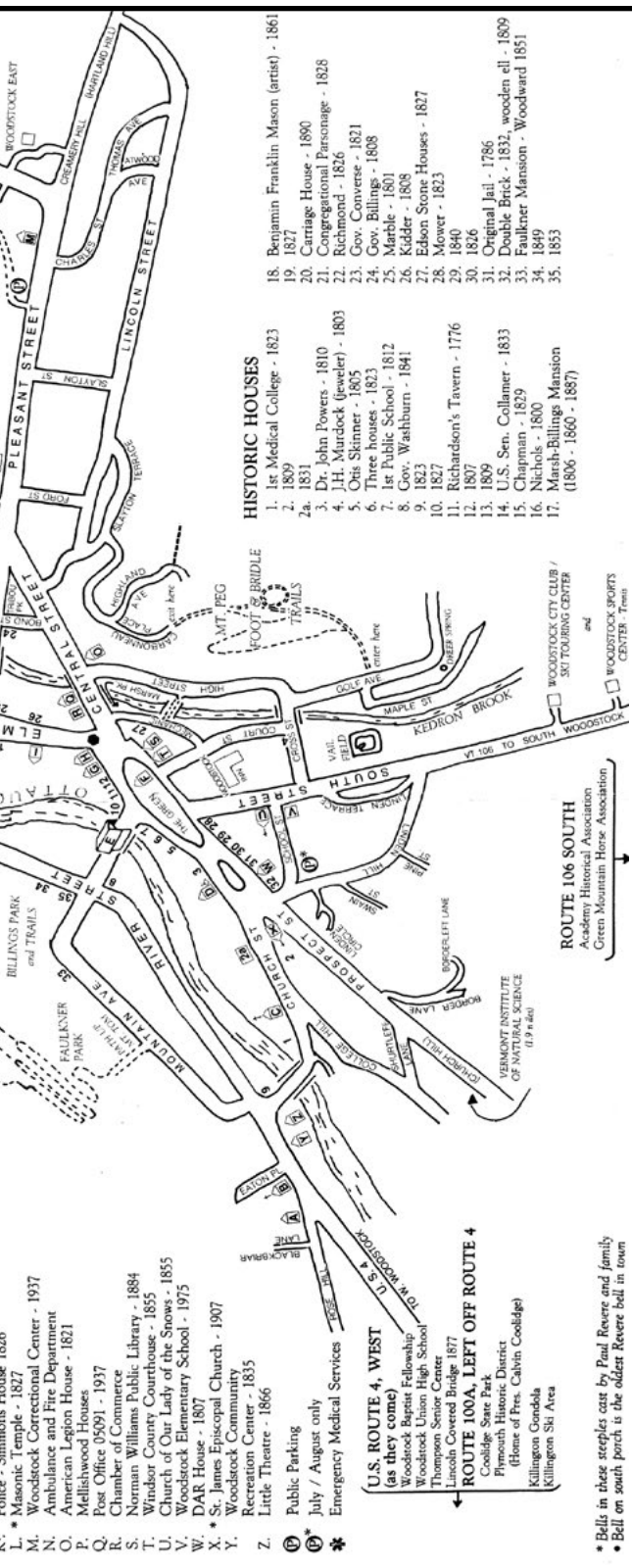

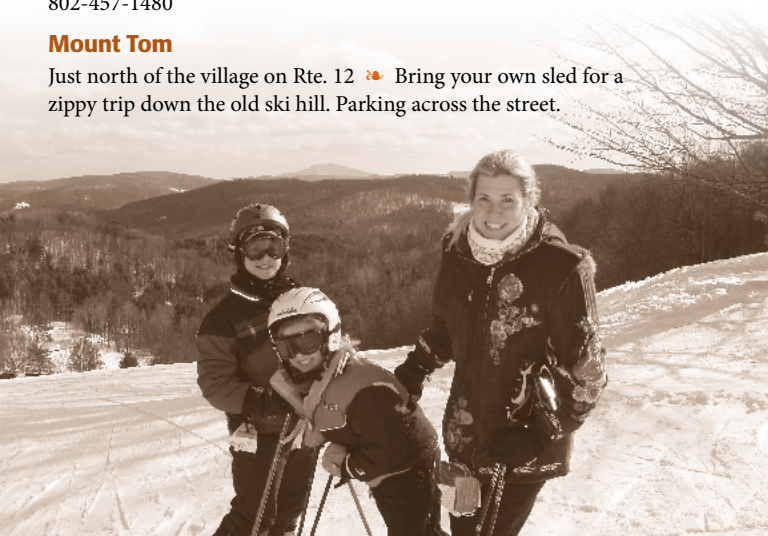
